The above valuation together with those tor other A.D. property was certified 11th Nov. 1873 by a William Smith, Iron Founder, Haydon Bridge. J.W. Dolphin, Wood Agent, Fremington, for the A.D. Company Ltd. and by Thomas Raw for Sir G.W. Denys Bart. In fact the plant at Sir Francis Level was not taken over by the A.D. Company at this time and remained the property of Sir George Denys the second until the level crosscut and level to the A.D. boundary was completed. At that time the price to the Company had been reduced to £800. At the time of the valuation there was a violent dispute between Sir George and a gentleman named Bewick over the true value of the equipment here and elsewhere.
