Two photographs of Longhorn or Wyndham Pit engine house, taken in 1983. The shaft was open to about 100 feet and partly filled with rubbish at that time.



Two mine was abandoned in the late 1920s and has been worked on and off since at least the 13th century. It was part of the Bigrigg Mine, latterly operated as Lord Leconfield's Hematite Iron Ore Mines, Whitehaven. The buildings in the photograph are situated just west of the main road, North of Egremont at N.G.R. NY 003126.
