Jeremiah Hutchinson of Reeth in the County of York Gentleman maketh oath and saith that he hath heard & beleives that the sd. Thos. Smith one of the Defts in this case pretending some Right thereto bath entered upon & taken posson of a certain Lead Mine called Beldi Hill Lead Mine in the Complts. Billmen^d to be situate and lying within and being this Deponent bath often times heard that of and believes part and parcel 1 of the Commons Common Wastes or Waste Ground which belongs to the Manor of Healaugh in the complts also ment^d. And this Depit. bath heard & beleives that the sd. Thos Smith bath recently granted Lease or Taken note thereof to the other Derts or some of them for some Term of years and this Dependent saith that the sd. Thos Smith & other Defts or his Undertennants or their workmen for some Time last past have actually worked the sd. Mine called Beldi Hill Lead Mine & have raised from & out of same a very considerable Quantities of Lead Ore and have sold and disposed therof for their own uses as this Depondent bath been informed & belaives and this Deft. also saith that he is Recr. of the Estates of the late Duke of Wharton & by the Direction of the Complts, sometime in or about the Month of February last gave Notice to the said Defts John Scott & Richd. Metcalfe of the Complts Right to the sd. Beldi Hill Lead Mine & claimed same for the sd. Complts and this Depondent saith that since the Notice given & claim so made by the

Dept as afs'd he this Dept required the said Deft John Scott and his partners to Desist from working the said Mine - But they absolutely refused so to do and now are working the sd. Lead Hine for their own Use and Benefit and this Deft further saith that he this Dept hath heard adn beleives that the sd Beldi Hill. Lead Mine is very beneficial and profitable & of Great Value & that the sd Defts or some of them are now working the same & raise great Quantities of Ore therefrom.

James Alderson of Stowe Gill in Westmoreland Yeoman aged 72 years maketh oath & saith that he knows & hath known a large moor common or Parcell of Waste Ground called Hall Edge or Hall Moor in Swaledale in the County of York for 49 years last past & upon oath saith that the same is and always during the Depts knowledge of the same bath been reputed and taken to be part & parcell of the moors commons or waste grnd within the Menor Healaugh in the sd County of York saith that about 30 years ago a Lead Mine Wl. thin the said moor or waste ground called Hall Edge or Hall Moor was begun to be wrought & called Beldi Hill Mine by Thos Clarkson Abraham Fryer & this Depondent who took the of Wm Clarkson an agent under Jas Close Esq Chief agent in the County under the trustees of the late Duke of Wharton saith that he this Dept. worked in the sd mine called Beldi Hill Mine along with one John Daking all the Time the said John Daking worked therein wch this Dept beleives was from the Month of May to the beginning of Decr. then next following without Interruption when this Depondent & others working in the sd Mine desisted from working therein being informed by the sd William Clarkson that there was no prospect of winning ore in the sd Mine or words to that effect, wch Discouraged this Dept & others from working any longer in the sd mine saith that he this Dept about 48 or 49 years ago went to live at East Stonesdale in the Manor of Healaugh & lived there for 19 years saith that during that Time this Dept Horses & cattle went upon the sd common or waste ground

called Hall Edge or Hall Moor without any manner of Molestation or Disturbance as part and parcell of the waste grnds of the Manor of Healaugh and that the sd Moor or waste is not divided or separated from the Rest of the Waste Grounds in the sd Manor by any Hedges or Fences Whatsoever but always during the Depondents Knowledge of the same hath been reputed to be & taken as part & parcell of Waste or common of the sd Manor & saith that the sd Moors or Wastes within the sd Manor go & are called by different Names in different parts of the sd Commons or Wastes and this Dept further saith that he believes & bath been informed that all the Mines & Minerals within the Moors and Wastes within the Manor of Healaugh belong to the Trustees of the sd Duke of Wharton and were reserved by them.

Hutchinson John Daking of Calvert House in Swaledale in the County of York - Miner aged 57 years maketh oath & saith that he knows Same) Beldi Hill Lead Mine & that the waste ground in which the sd Beldi Hill Lead Mine is situate & being is commonly called and known by the name of Hall Edge or Hall Moor & is within the Manor of Healaugh and saith that he has known the sd Manor for 30 years last past this Dept having so long ago wrought as a Miner or Workman within the sd Mine under Thomas Clarkson & Abraham Fryer Lessees of the Trustees of the late Duke of Wharton who took the same of Jos Close Esq Chief Agent in the Country of the sd Trustees as this Deponent was informed by the sd Clarkson & Fryer saith that he began to work in the sd Mine sometime in the Month of May 1738 & continued to work therein under the sd Thos Clarkson & Abraham Fryer until the beginning of the Month of Decr then next following and this Dept further saith that the sd Wast or Common called Hall Edge or Hall Moor in wch the sd Mine called. Beldi Hill Mine is situated & being is part and parcell of the Commons Moors or Waste Grds with the sd Manor of Healaugh & has been looked upon and reputed to be such during all this Depondents knowledge of the same & not fenced of or seperated from the other part or parts of the sd Moors or Waste Grounds within the sd Manors by any Hedges or Fences whatsoever But saith that the sd Moor or Waste Grd within the sd Manor in different parts thereof are called and known by Different Names and this Deponent bath also heard, been informed and always understood that all the Nines and Minerals of what Nature soever within the Common & Waste Grds within the Manor of Healaugh afosd were reserved by the sd Trustees saith that he this Dept & others working on the Mine for the Time above set forth wrought in the said Mine without any Disturbance or Interruption whatsoever and that one Jas Alderson wrought with this Deft in the sd Mine & the
